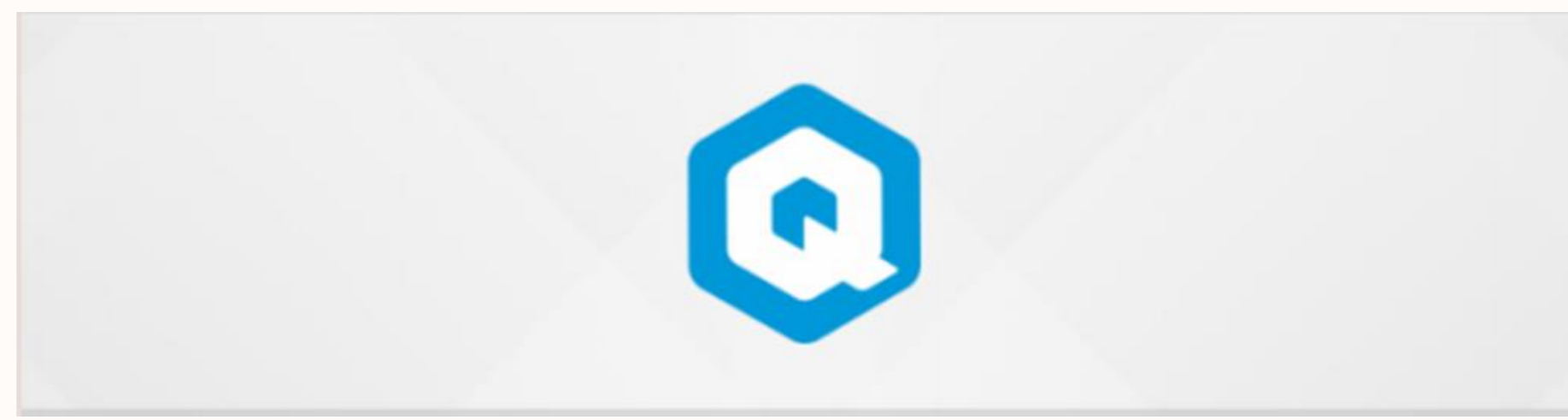


Electronic System for Institutional Evaluation and Program Accreditation - QMS



QMS enables to move evaluation process within one online system. It is accessible for all involved parties

One of the major goals of the NCEQE strategy is to automatize its services via electronic platform.

1. Application (HEI)

HEIs make online submission of the application through the qms.eqe.ge platform. Each HEI has an individual user account, where past applications will be archived and accessible. HEIs will be able to monitor each step of the evaluation.

2. Assembling Experts' Team (NCEQE)

After the application is submitted, coordinator from the NCEQE assembles experts' team for the evaluation and share application with supporting materials with them. All the necessary data on experts pool is regularly updated in QMS.

3. Desk study and site-visit agenda (EXPERTS' TEAM)

Experts study materials and prepare site-visit agenda, which is facilitated by the NCEQE. Experts also fill-in questions mapping grid, which is integrated in QMS and identify the main lines for inquiry.

4. Site-visit at HEI and draft report

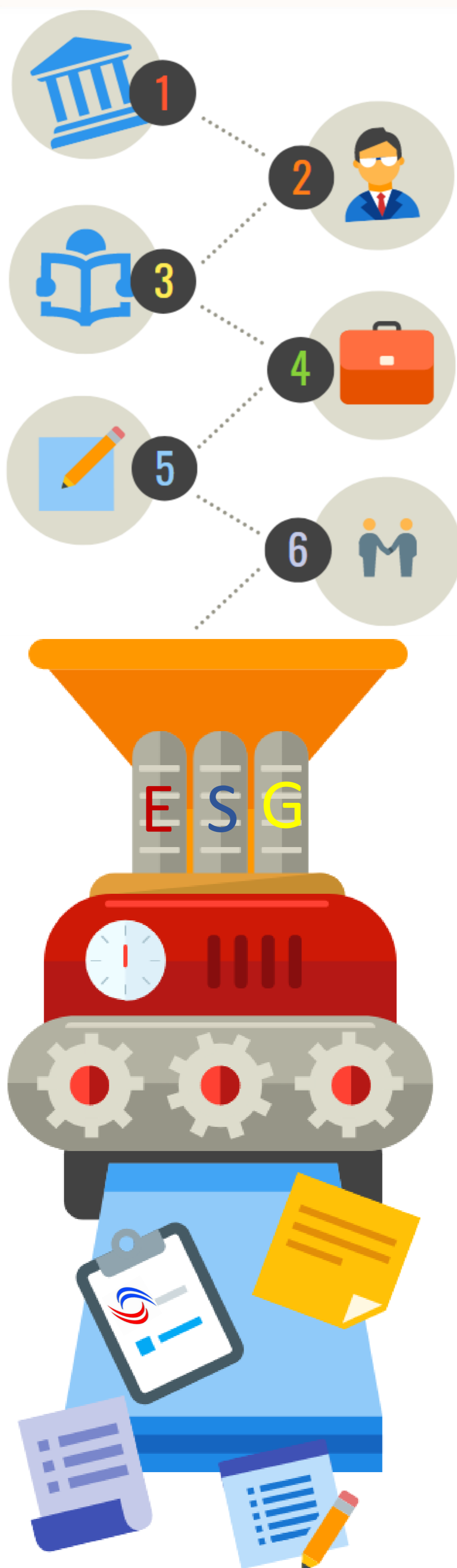
Experts follow agenda and mapping grid, at the end of the site-visit starting to draft the report, which is integrated in QMS.

5. Final Report

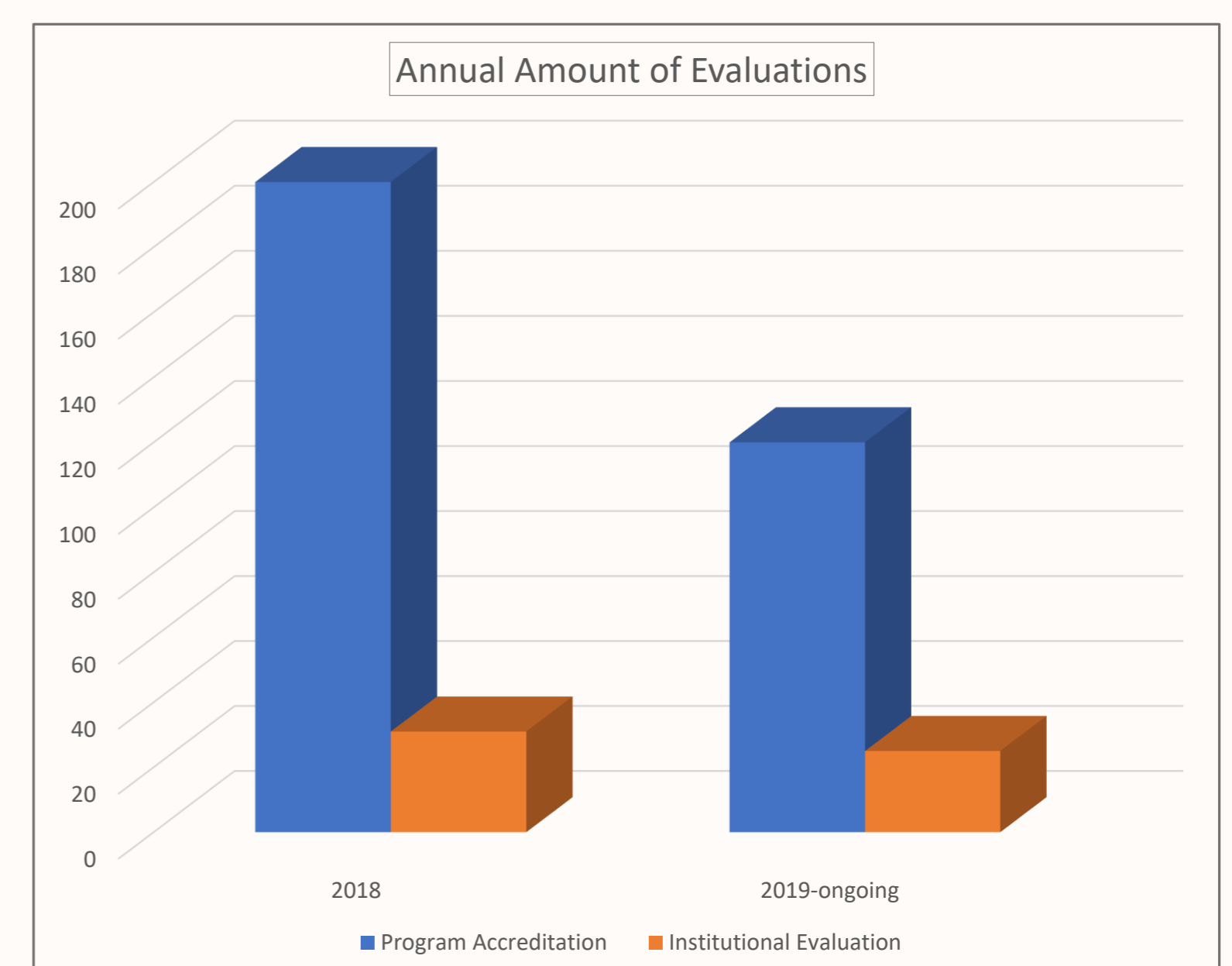
After submission of the draft report, HEI prepares evidence-based position on factual errors. Considering the evidence-based position, experts' team submit final report.

6. Council meeting

Authorization/Accreditation Council members access the application, and the HEIs report through QMS. Council members vote through the online platform.



The NCEQE plans to monitor expert workloads via QMS.
