

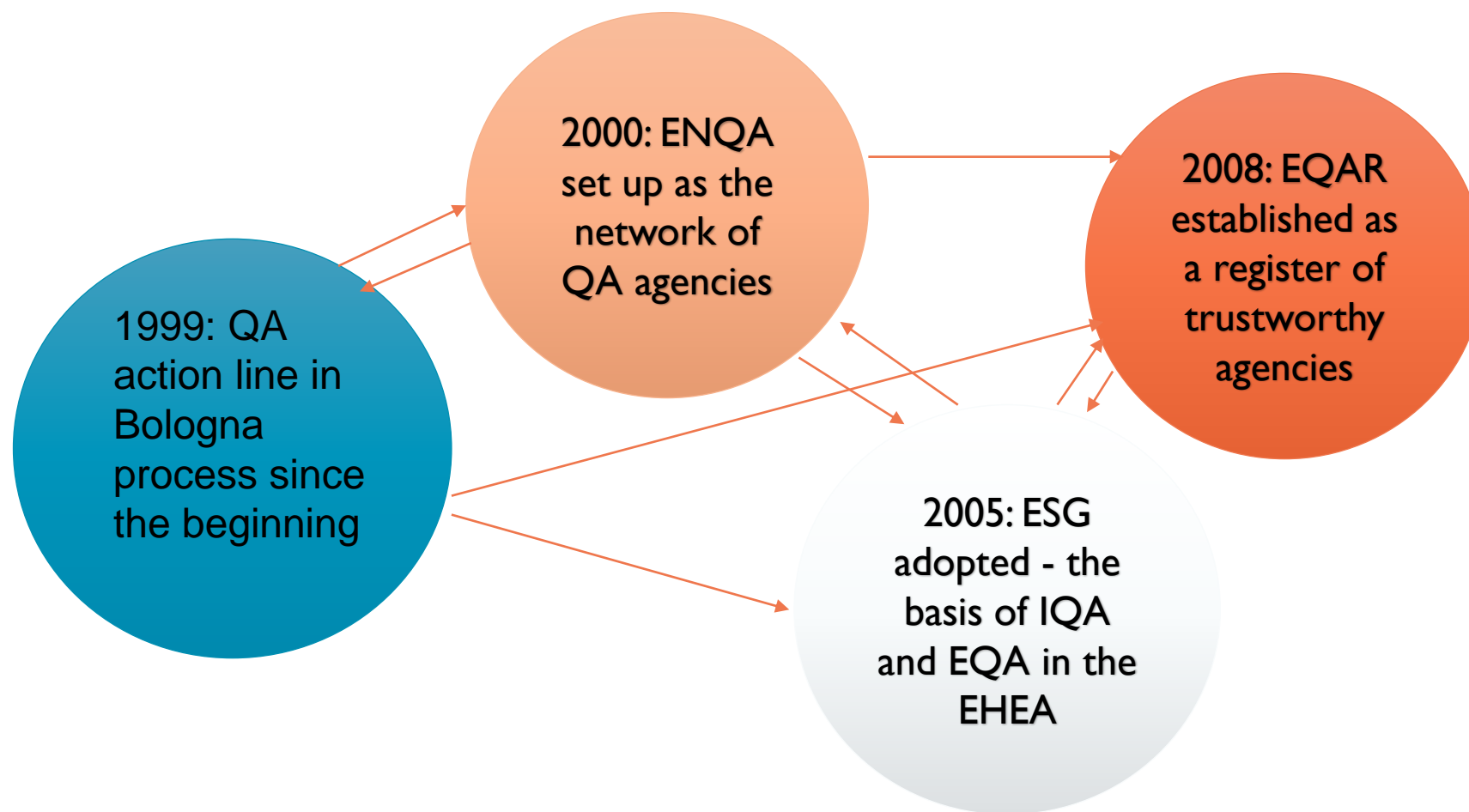

THE THREE BOLOGNA PROCESS KEY COMMITMENTS

- A Three-Cycle System compatible with the QF-EHEA
- Compliance with the Lisbon Recognition Convention (LRC)
- **Quality Assurance in compliance with the Standards and Guidelines for Quality Assurance in the European Higher Education Area (ESG)**

THE BIGG AND PEER SUPPORT GROUPS

- Since the 2018 EHEA Ministerial Conference "a structured peer support approach based on solidarity, cooperation and mutual learning"
- Coordinated by the Bologna Implementation Coordination Group, reporting to the BFUG
- Thematic Peer-support Groups (TPG) for each key commitment:
 - Peer learning activities
 - Peer support including “match-making” of need and offer of expertise
 - Projects and other activities to support legislative change, information exchange, creation of support tools, etc. → progress also beyond 2020

ENQA MESSAGE TO MINISTERIAL CONFERENCE

- Create and safeguard the necessary conditions that enable quality assurance agencies to work with appropriate levels of independence and flexibility
- Allow and encourage student participation in quality assurance
- Enable quality assurance agencies to fulfil their mission to operate in the public interest
- Ensure that institutions may effectively use the European Approach for Quality Assurance of Joint Programmes
