

Online quality assurance: Call for contributions from ENQA members

ENQA is seeking contributions from members and affiliates for a webinar on the topic of online quality assurance.

A year after the Covid-19 pandemic hit Europe, many quality assurance agencies have gathered significant experience of moving their external quality assurance activities online, including expert training, site visits and decision-making meetings. Some agencies enhanced existing procedures while others developed entirely new approaches. Sharing of practice was an important facilitator in the early stages of developing temporary online procedures in response to the pandemic. As a follow up to this, ENQA will organise another webinar in which agencies can share the lessons learnt from the past year. The aims of the webinar is to provide support and inspiration for further development as well as to discuss the impact of these experiences on the “new normal”.

ENQA is calling for case examples from members and affiliates to be presented during the webinar. Contributions should focus on one specific aspect of conducting online quality assurance (not a general description of procedures).

Topics of specific interest include:

- Training of experts
- Analysis of feedback
- Unexpected lessons learnt
- Future use of online/hybrid site visits

Around six contributions will be selected for presentation during the webinar, with each presenter given a slot of 5-7 minutes. Time will also be allocated for questions and discussion with the audience.

The webinar will take place on Wednesday 21 April, 10.00-11.30 CEST. It will form part of the ENQA online Members' Forum and will be open exclusively to members and affiliates.

In case a large number of submissions are received, ENQA will consider holding a second webinar on the same topic, or disseminating the case examples in another manner.

Submission process

Submissions to this call should consist of:

- 2-3 slides to be used during the webinar, for a presentation of 5-7 minutes
- Written summary of the main points of the presentation (maximum 250 words)
- Completed submission form (see [here](#))

The deadline for submissions is Monday 29 March.

The call is open only to ENQA members and affiliates.

The selection of contributions will be made by the ENQA secretariat. Presenters will be informed by Friday 2 April.
