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Benchlearning - what and how?

WHAT


- Enhancement-led evaluation is a fundamental operating principle of FINEEC.
- Benchlearning method is part of the FINEEC thirdcycle audit framework for 2019-2024
- Through benchlearning, FINEEC wishes to encourage all Finnish HEIs to use benchlearning as a method as part of their quality work.
- The purpose of benchlearning is to receive feedback on the own organisation's activities and to learn from the good practices of another organisation.

HOW

- The HEI selects a topic and a partner for benchlearning. The HEI may select several partners.
- The scope of the activity may vary and is decided by the benchlearning partners; however, it needs to be connected to at least one of the evaluation areas of the audit.
- The HEI reports about the benchlearning to FINEEC in connection with the self-assessment report - how was benchlearning process implemented; what good practices the HEI identified in the own and partner organisation; and how the HEI plans to apply the new ideas.
- In the final audit report, the benchlearning project will not be assessed as such.
- However, each HEI will receive audit team's feedback and proposals on how to proceed.
