

#### The HEI in the AI world


- New graduate competencies sought

"There's a tsunami coming,"





Our image of the threat/promise of AI to academia may be like RoboProf...



... but the impact on the academy as institution might ultimately be more University Terminator...









#### QAA in AI world

- Adopting AI tools for operational efficiency
  - For example:
  - Scheduling
  - Document preparation and management
  - Meeting notes
  - Qualitative and quantitative analysis
- Doing research/offering advice/setting standards for HEIs
  - For incorporation of AI into curricula
  - For adoption of AI-based pedagogy
  - For responding to [AI]<sup>2</sup>
- Smart interface with AI-enabled IQA
