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Timeline



- 2013 ENQA Agency Review of former Accreditation Committee: non-compliant, main issue - independence
- 2014-2018: new legal framework
- 2019-2020: issuance of accreditation standards (criteria)
- 2020-2022: HEIs complying with standards
- 2023-2024: initial institutional accreditation
- 2023 ENQA Agency Review

Nature of Changes



- From accreditation of individual study programmes to institutional responsibility
- From (state) accreditation to independent quality assurance and enhancement (ESG 2015), balanced involvement of stakeholders
- From formal evaluation to content peer reviews (a pool of reviewers)

Factors of Success



- Legislation
- International resources
 - Learning from ENQA/EQAR public documentation
 - Project SEQA-ESG, ENQA Leadership Programme
 - Learning from other agencies (staff mobilities, observers, best practice)
- Trainings/briefings
 - All stakeholders (HEIs, students and employers), incl. staff and reviewers
- Agency's strategic planning & rapid improvements
 - (internal PDCA cycles shortened & "asynchronous")
